

TWO MORE TROPHIES FOR 'WE THE PEOPLE OF RI' AT THE 2010 PEG AWARDS 'Free Speech' TV Program Earns High Praise

PAWTUCKET, Rhode Island, Nov. 12, 2010 – We The People of RI, a popular Rhode Island public access cable television show with the sole purpose of informing, educating and entertaining the community with fresh perspectives on world, national and local issues and events, won two additional PEG awards today, for a total of eight awards in the three years since the show's creation.

The PEG Awards are hosted annually to recognize the best non-professional, non-commercial public access programming in the Public, Education and Government access arenas. The contest is organized by "PEG RI-TV," Rhode Island's public access provider. Entries are judged by a panel of out-of-state television production professionals.

Nominated in six categories, the show won Best Magazine-Format or News Program, and Best Cooperative Effort with a School/Non-Profit Group for a video filmed by show producer Brian Crowley, for the Combined Federal Campaign's charitable donation drive. This year, We The People of RI was also chosen as a finalist for the John Notte III Best Program Award. Previously, the show garnered awards for Best Educational Program and Best Coverage of an Event, as well as Best Editing and Best Series.

"We're just out here trying to make a difference," said Crowley. "We entertain people, and we give them a platform to express their freedom of speech, but we also want to educate our viewers and participants on today's hot-button issues, to create smarter voters."
